MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

Complainant brings these judicial complaints against a federal circuit judge and a federal district judge pursuant to the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act, 28 U.S.C. §§ 351-364. The Act provides an administrative remedy for "conduct prejudicial to the effective and expeditious administration of the business of the courts" and for judicial inability to "discharge all the duties of office by reason of mental or physical disability." 28 U.S.C. § 351(a).

In 2014, complainant filed judicial complaint No. 04-14-90112 against a federal district judge. The complaint was dismissed. Complainant then filed judicial complaint No. 04-14-90121 against the federal circuit judge who dismissed the complaint against the district judge. That complaint was also dismissed. Petitions for review by the judicial council were filed in both cases and denied. In 2015, complainant filed combined judicial complaint Nos. 04-15-90022 and 04-15-90023,

naming both the federal circuit judge and the federal district judge. Those complaints were also dismissed.

Complainant again brings combined judicial complaints against the same federal circuit judge and federal district judge. He again alleges that the judicial complaint process is rife with forgery and counterfeiting of orders and correspondence. Complainant has now added the undersigned's order dismissing complaint Nos. 04-15-90022 and 04-15-90023 to the list of forged and counterfeit documents.

A complaint of misconduct under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act is subject to dismissal if it "is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred." Rule 11(c)(1)(D), Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii).

Complainant's judicial complaint records disclose no forgery, counterfeiting, or other irregularity in the filing, consideration, or disposition of his complaints or petitions for review. Complainant's allegations of forgery, counterfeiting, and related misdeeds are frivolous. Accordingly, these complaints are dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii).

Complainant is advised that repetitive filing of harassing or frivolous judicial complaints will lead to imposition of

restrictions against future filings. See Rule 10, Rules for
Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings.
