PER CURIAM:

Dennis I. Green, a North Carolina inmate, appeals the district court's order denying relief upon his pro se petition for writ of mandamus under 28 U.S.C.A. § 1915A (West Supp. 1999). We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and find that this appeal is frivolous. Accordingly, we dismiss the appeal on the reasoning of the district court. See Green v. Dupree, No. CA-99-571-CT-5-H (E.D.N.C. Dec. 21, 1999).
