PER CURIAM:

James M. Debardeleben appeals the district court's order denying relief on his 42 U.S.C.A. § 1983 (West Supp. 2000) complaint. We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm on the reasoning of the district court. See Debardeleben v. Black, No. CA-00-2391-WMN (D. Md. filed Sept. 7, 2000; entered Sept. 8, 2000). Debardeleben's motion to file a supplemental pro se brief is denied, and his motion for decision is denied as moot.
