PER CURIAM:

Yolanda Miller appeals a district court order granting summary judgment to Personal-Touch of Virginia, Incorporated and dismissing her complaint under the Family Medical Leave Act, 29 U.S.C. §§ 2601 - 2654 (2000). We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and affirm for the reasons cited by the district court.* See Miller v. Personal-Touch of Va., No. CA-04-110 (E.D. Va. Nov. 3, 2004).
