PER CURIAM:

Monte Clay Mosley appeals the district court's order denying his motion for reconsideration of an order granting relief on his motion for reduction of sentence under 18 U.S.C. § 3582(c) (2006). We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we deny Mosley's motion for appointment of counsel and affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. United States v.
