PER CURIAM:

Appellant appeals the district court's orders dismissing Appellant's complaint alleging employment discrimination claims and denying Appellant's motion to vacate the district court's order dismissing his complaint. Appellant also appeals the district court's order denying his motion for recusal and granting his motion to proceed in forma pauperis. We have reviewed the records and the district court's opinions and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm on the reasoning of the district court. Wilder v. Shalala, No. CA-96-3742-S (D. Md.
