PER CURIAM:

George W. Woodson appeals the district court's order denying relief on his 42 U.S.C.A. § 1983 (West Supp. 1998) complaint. We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion accepting the magistrate judge's recommendation and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm on the reasoning of the district court. See Woodson v. City of Charleston's Metro Drug Unit, No. CA-98-229-2 (S.D.W. Va. June 4, 1998). We deny Woodson's motions for appointment of counsel and extension of time to perfect his appeal. We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before the court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
