PER CURIAM:

Howard M. Moore, Jr., appeals the district court's order dismissing his action alleging employment discrimination and related claims. We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm on the reasoning of the district court. See Moore v. Board of Educ., No. CA-97-3178-AMD (D. Md. Jan. 28, 1999).* We grant the motion to submit the case to the court without oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before the court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
