PER CURIAM:

Brian K. Gage appeals the district court's order granting summary judgment in his former employer's favor in this disability discrimination action. We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm on the reasoning of the district court. See Gage v. Runyon, No. CA-97-1885-AMD (D. Md. July 27, 1999).* We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before the court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
