PER CURIAM:

John Lee Cameron appeals the district court's order adopting the magistrate judge's recommendation and denying relief on his 42 U.S.C.A. § 1983 (West Supp. 1999) complaint. We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion accepting the magistrate judge's recommendation and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm on the reasoning of the district court. See Cameron v. Taylor, No. CA-98-2026-5-24AK (D.S.C. July 29, 1999).
