PER CURIAM:

Douglas Scardo appeals the district court's order granting summary judgment in favor of Metropolitan Life Insurance Company (MetLife) on his claim that MetLife unreasonably terminated his long-term disability benefits. We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm on the reasoning of the district court. See Scardo v. Metropolitan Life Ins.
