PER CURIAM:

Orrin L. Jackson seeks to appeal the district court's order denying his motion filed under 28 U.S.C.A. § 2255 (West Supp. 2000). We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we deny a certificate of appealability and dismiss the appeal on the reasoning of the district court. See United States v. Jackson, No. CR-90-85 (W.D.N.C. Mar. 8, 2000). To the extent that Jackson seeks to appeal from his December 13, 1990, judgment of conviction and sentence, we dismiss the appeal as untimely. See Fed. R. App. P. 4(b). We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before the court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
