PER CURIAM:

Ahmad Muhammad seeks to appeal the district court's order denying his motion filed under 28 U.S.C.A. § 2255 (West Supp. 2001). We have reviewed the record and the district court's opinion and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we deny a certificate of appealability and dismiss the appeal on the reasoning of the district court, see United States v. Muhammad, No. CR-96-43 (E.D. Va. Dec. 12, 2001), and on the grounds that the action is successive.
