PER CURIAM:

Charles Davis Burrell appeals the district court's order denying relief on his 42 U.S.C. § 1983 (2000) complaint and entering a pre-filing injunction. We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. See Burrell v. Jackson, No. CA-03-198-3 (E.D. Va. filed Apr. 21, 2003 & entered Apr. 22, 2003; May 9, 2003). We deny Burrell's motion for appointment of counsel.
