PER CURIAM:

Eric Vongrastic Logan, a federal prisoner, appeals the district court's order denying relief on his civil complaint, in which he sought credit for time served pretrial to be applied against his federal bank robbery sentence. United States, No. CA-98-14-F (E.D.N.C. May 26, 1998).
