PER CURIAM:

John L. Joswick appeals the magistrate judge's order granting summary judgment to his former employer in his employment discrimination action filed under the Americans with Disabilities Act 42 U.S.C.A. §§ 12101-12213 (West 1994 & Supp. 1999).^{*} We have reviewed the record and the magistrate judge's opinion and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm on the reasoning of the magistrate judge. See Joswick v. Johns Hopkins Univ. Applied Physics Lab., No. CA-98-3041-PJM (D. Md. Sept. 30, 1999).
